The CHCPRT025 Identify and report children and young people at risk unit, describes the skills and knowledge required to support and protect children and young people who are at risk of harm.

This unit forms part of the CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care, and the CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care and assists Approved providers maintain compliance with Regulation 84 of the National Regulations.
